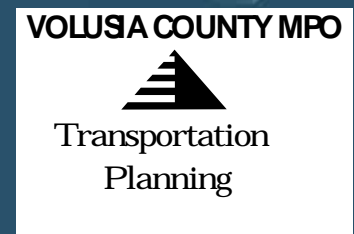
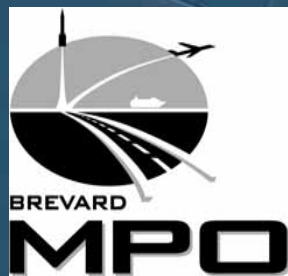

Formation of Orlando-Volusia MPO Alliance - June 1997

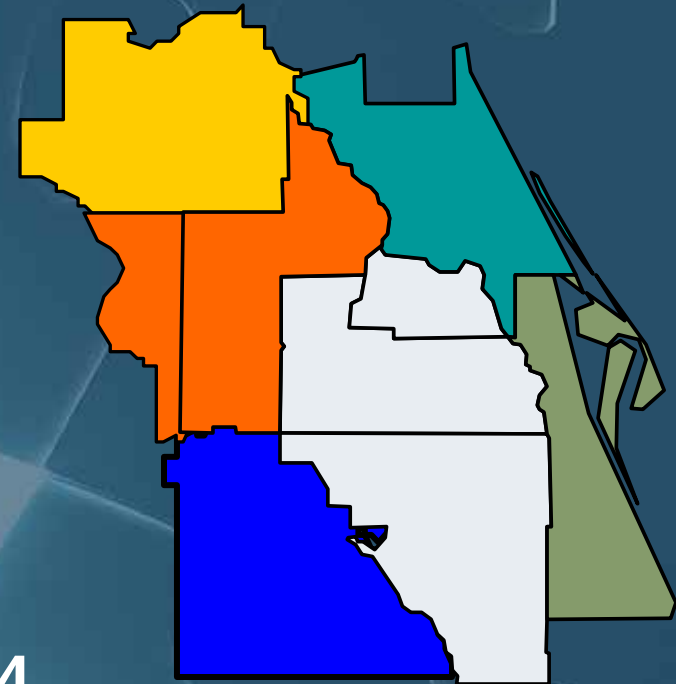
METROPLAN ORLANDO-Brevard County cooperative planning agreement - May 1999

Alliance Agreement Stipulates...

- Forum for information exchange
- Coordination of regional planning and policy development with FDOT
- Identify regional transportation opportunities
- Solve regional transportation issues



Current Structure

- 18 members (3 from each of 6 MPOs)
- Operates on basis of consensus
- FDOT participation
- Quarterly meetings
- Rotating staff support



Regional Long Range Plan

- Synthesized existing Year 2020 LRTPs
- Encouraged “big picture” thinking
- Identified gaps
- Adopted December 2003
